



# Dissemination & Implementation of CTI

#### **Face-to-Face Trainings:**

8 hours: course instruction over 1.5 days

8 hours: team assignments after the training

8 hours: telephone consultations (instructor + team members)

Total: 24 hours


1 hr/week: Training Module









#### **Satisfaction by Intervention**




### Confidence to Implement by Intervention (Mean scores on confidence scale: 1=not at all confident - 5=extremely confident)


