21,000+ homeless people in Orange County

Public school districts identified 22,000 Orange County students living in unstable housing conditions

There are only 3,400 shelter beds available

High-entry qualifications at many agencies leave many homeless people on the streets.

Root Cause:

A critical shortage of affordable permanent housing

A minimum wage worker has to work 125 hour/week to afford a one-bedroom apartment

A shortage of affordable housing for renters can instigate a cycle of poverty

Cost to taxpayers:

"...150,000 chronically homeless people in the U.S cost \$10.95 billion per year in public funds, if these individuals were all permanently housed, the expense would be expected to fall to \$7.88 billion..."
